2. Federal THC Revenue Under a National Legal Market

Appendix - Economic Proof-of-Concept: How Vision 2028 Pays for Itself

I. Ground rules: what "paid for" means in this plan

Vision 2028 is not a fantasy wishlist. It is a long-horizon restructuring of where the United States spends its money and what we get back for it.

When I say this plan is "paid for," I mean three things:

- 1. We free up existing dollars by cutting waste, bloat, and perverse incentives in systems that already cost us trillions every year.
- 2. We raise new revenue from places that have been under-taxed, under-enforced, or entirely untaxed for decades.
- 3. We recycle those dollars into investments that create real value: jobs, infrastructure, health, education, and stability.

Numbers below are **annual** amounts once the plan is fully phased in. They are not promises down to the last decimal. They are conservative, reality-checked ranges that show this roadmap is fiscally possible and economically sane.

II. Where the money goes today (very rough baselines)

- Health care: In 2023, the United States spent about \$4.9 trillion on health care, roughly 17.6% of the entire economy, or \$14,570 per person. That is the highest in the developed world and we still leave people sick, broke, or both.
- **Defense:** National defense spending sits in the \$900–960 billion per-year range, and current political plans flirt with pushing it toward or beyond \$1 trillion a year.
- Infrastructure: Public infrastructure spending (federal, state, and local) is on the order of \$600+ billion per year, mostly driven by states and cities, and it has been stuck around this share of GDP for decades. Roads, bridges, and pipes age faster than we fix them.
- Tax compliance: The IRS estimates a gross annual tax gap of about \$696 billion in taxes legally owed but not paid on time. On top of that, research on corporate tax avoidance shows \$94–135 billion a year lost to profit-shifting and havens, and high-profile reports show giant corporations and ultra-wealthy individuals getting away with very low effective tax rates.

Vision 2028 does not require inventing new money out of thin air. It assumes we grow up as a country and stop lighting hundreds of billions on fire every single year.

III. Major savings and new revenue streams

A. Health-care reform: universal care with lower bills

National health expenditures are around **\$4.9 trillion** per year. Serious work on single-payer and universal coverage shows that if we cut administrative bloat, negotiate drug prices, and simplify billing, the United States can save on the order of **10–15**% of total health spending while covering everyone. Take a middle-of-the-road number: a **13**% efficiency gain on \$4.9T is about **\$640 billion per year** in gross savings.

Vision 2028 does not pretend we just pocket all of that. The assumption is:

- Roughly \$390 billion per year gets reinvested into:
 - o primary care,
 - o mental health and addiction treatment,
 - o rural and tribal hospitals,
 - o preventive care,
 - and actually paying nurses, aides, and frontline workers like the backbone they are.
- About \$250 billion per year remains as a net system-wide saving compared to the status-quo trajectory.

That **\$250B** is the health-care "dividend" that helps fund the rest of this roadmap without increasing the overall health-care bill.

B. Military realignment: strong defense, no endless blank checks

We can defend the United States without a permanent \$1 trillion yearly check to the Pentagon.

Vision 2028 keeps:

- troop pay,
- veterans' care, and

genuine defensive readiness

fully funded. The cuts land on:

- redundant weapons systems that even defense insiders quietly say we do not need,
- endless foreign base sprawl with vague missions and no exit strategy,
- open-ended procurement and nuclear modernization programs that run hundreds of billions over budget.

Instead of racing toward \$1T, we deliberately move the other way. Over roughly a decade we:

- cap national defense spending below the trillion-dollar mark, and
- reduce it by about **15–20% relative to the current trajectory**, mostly by trimming waste and foreign adventures.

In plain numbers, that's about **\$150–\$200 billion per year** in savings once the shift is fully phased in.

This is not a cut to the people who serve. It's a cut to the industries that have learned how to turn fear into a permanent subsidy.

C. Tax justice and real enforcement

The IRS tax gap is about **\$696 billion per year**. Add in corporate profit-shifting and high-end avoidance and we're talking hundreds of billions of potential revenue sitting just offstage in shell companies and creative accounting.

Vision 2028 assumes we finally take this seriously:

- Modernize the IRS so it can actually audit complex returns instead of just hassling wage earners.
- End the most abusive forms of corporate profit-shifting and offshore parking.
- Tighten rules on large pass-through entities, private-equity loopholes, and "laundromat" shell structures.

We don't assume perfection. We assume modest competence:

 Recover about 15% of the current tax gap ⇒ roughly \$100 billion per year in additional revenue, heavily concentrated at the top end of income and corporate profits.

That is conservative relative to the total available.

D. THC legalization and a federal excise that doesn't gouge people

States that have legalized cannabis for adult use have already collected more than **\$4.4 billion** per year in cannabis taxes on legal sales around **\$30.1 billion** (2024), and the market is still expanding.

Right now it's a patchwork: uneven rules, restricted access, and an active illicit market.

Vision 2028 does three things:

- 1. **Full federal legalization** of THC products nationwide.
- 2. A **flat, uniform federal excise tax** on THC content and weight (not retail price), so we do not punish small businesses or make products insanely expensive.
- 3. A **modest rate** in the single-digit to low-double-digit percent range: high enough to matter, low enough that legal products stay competitive with the illicit market.

In a normalized, national market with legal sales eventually well above today's \$30B, a modest federal excise can **conservatively** raise about **\$5–8 billion per year** in federal revenue.

This is not the biggest line item in the budget, and it's not meant to be. It is:

- clean, predictable revenue,
- funding public-health campaigns, substance-abuse treatment, and social-equity programs,
- all while displacing criminal markets and finally treating THC as a regulated product instead of a political stunt.

IV. What we actually fund with this

Here is a simple central scenario once the plan is fully phased in, with all amounts in **billions of dollars per year**.

Freed resources (annual, central estimate)

- +\$250B from health-care efficiency and drug negotiation, after reinvestment in care
- +\$200B from military rebalancing and ending blank-check foreign adventurism
- +\$100B from serious tax enforcement and loophole closure
- + \$8B from a modest federal THC excise

Total new fiscal space: ≈ +\$558B per year

New investments (annual, central estimate)

- -\$150B for housing, homelessness, and neighborhood repair
 - social housing,
 - o rehab of existing stock,
 - homelessness prevention,
 - help for first-time buyers and renters.
- -\$120B for climate, clean energy, and resilience
 - o grid upgrades,
 - o renewables,
 - efficiency retrofits,
 - disaster resilience and local climate adaptation.
- **-\$80B** for education and student-debt relief
 - early childhood,

- o K-12 support,
- public college and trade programs,
- targeted debt cancellation and refinancing.
- **-\$70B** for childcare and eldercare
 - making it possible to work and care for family,
 - o with living-wage jobs for caregivers.
- -\$60B for rural and digital infrastructure
 - o broadband,
 - water systems,
 - o transportation,
 - the basics in places our politics have ignored.

Total new outlays: ≈ -\$480B per year

Rough remaining margin: ≈ +\$78B per year

That leftover can go to deficit reduction, additional targeted programs, or act as a buffer if some savings arrive more slowly than expected.

V. Jobs: where the 9-16 million comes from

Infrastructure and care work are two of the most job-dense things a nation can buy.

Economic research shows that **each \$100 billion** in well-designed infrastructure investment supports roughly **1 million job-years** in the near term when you add up direct, indirect, and induced jobs.

Vision 2028 channels about \$400–500B per year into:

• **Hard infrastructure:** roads, bridges, transit, grid upgrades, water systems, public buildings.

- Green infrastructure: clean energy, home and building retrofits, resilience projects.
- **Social infrastructure:** schools, childcare, eldercare, health-care expansion, mental-health and addiction services.

At that scale, you get something like:

- 4–5 million job-years per year directly and indirectly tied to new public investment.
- Additional millions of private-sector jobs as businesses expand to meet demand, build things, and serve families who finally have disposable income and stability.

Across a 10-year build-out, that is how we land in the **9–16 million jobs range** you talk about elsewhere in the manifesto: not as a vibe, but as the aggregated, multi-year impact of concrete work in every town, city, and rural county in the country.

VI. Why this is realistic

Is it aggressive? Yes. Is it magic? No.

1. We're mostly reshuffling money we already spend badly.

Bloated health-care overhead, redundant weapons, tolerated tax evasion. We are not betting everything on 5% GDP growth or Wall Street mercy.

- 2. The numbers are deliberately conservative.
 - Health-care: we assume ~\$250B net saved after pumping hundreds of billions into better care.
 - Defense: we assume a 15–20% reduction vs a path already racing past \$900B toward \$1T.
 - o Tax justice: we count on recovering only a slice of legally-owed but unpaid taxes.
 - THC: we assume single-digit billions of annual federal revenue, even though the industry's growth could push it higher.
- 3. The investments have strong multipliers.

Infrastructure, clean energy, and care work do not just cost money, they **grow** the economy. Conservative estimates put many infrastructure multipliers above 1, which means each public dollar generates more than a dollar of GDP over time, and these are

things you can literally point at in your community.

4. This is a 40-50 year roadmap, not a one-year shock.

Vision 2028 phases in change over decades. Defense realignment, health-care restructuring, and tax-system modernization happen on timelines that give industries and communities room to adapt.

5. The alternative is what we're living right now.

- o Trillions in health spending, with families still going bankrupt over basic care.
- Nearly a trillion a year on "defense" while our own infrastructure crumbles.
- Billions left on the table every year because we'd rather look away from tax games.
- A booming THC market with chaotic rules, equity as an afterthought, and criminal markets thriving in the gaps.

Vision 2028 says: we stop pretending this is normal and start spending like a country that actually wants a future.

VII. Bottom line

In a central, conservative scenario, once fully phased in, Vision 2028:

- Frees up ≈ \$550–600B per year through health-care efficiency, military realignment, serious tax enforcement, and a modest THC excise.
- Invests ≈ \$450–500B per year in housing, infrastructure, climate, education, childcare, eldercare, and rural/digital rebuilds.
- Supports millions of new jobs per year, adding up to roughly 9–16 million across the full program as it scales.
- Leaves room for deficit reduction, buffers, or additional social programs instead of blowing up the national debt.

This is not a utopian wish list. It is a hard reset of priorities using numbers we can defend in public. It trades waste for work, fear for stability, and stagnation for a future we actually build on purpose.
